Extended Producer Responsibility

Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) is a policy approach whereby responsibility for a product's end-of-life management is shifted from local government and taxpayers to the producers of that product. BC has a growing list of EPR programs for products including:

- Smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors
- Used oil, filters, containers and used antifreeze.
- Household batteries
- Automotive batteries
- Cell phones and cell phone accessories
- Residential lighting including bulbs and fixtures.
- A wide range of electronic devices
- Small appliances (e.g., toaster, vacuum cleaner)
- Outdoor power equipment (e.g., lawn mower)
- Leftover medicines
- Paints, flammable liquids, and pesticides
- Tires
- Beverage containers
- Residential containers, packaging, cardboard, and mixed paper
