The Secretary General of the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) sent a letter to Internet Service Providers (ISPs) to encourage their customers to participate in Phase 3 of the Measuring Broadband Canada (MBC) project.

#### **Volunteer Firefighter & Search and Rescue Tax Credit**

The Board approved sending a letter to MP Gordon Johns to support Bill C-310: An *Act* to Amend the *Income Tax Act* (Volunteer Firefighting and Search and Rescue Volunteer Tax Credits) in order to increase the amount of the tax credits for volunteer firefighting and search and rescue volunteer services from \$3,000 to \$10,000. There are 90,000 volunteer firefighters and 8,000 search and rescue volunteers in Canada. The RDBN has approximately 225 volunteer firefighters and 120 search and rescue volunteers.
