## Smithers-Telkwa Multi-use Trail Receives Full Funding

**Smithers, B.C.** – The Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako (RDBN) and Cycle 16 Trail Society are thrilled by today's announcement from the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure that the remaining phases of the Smithers-Telkwa multi-use trail are fully funded through the Ministry's Active Transportation Capital Fund. <u>Find the announcement from the Province here</u>.

The Cycle 16 Trail Society has undertaken years of community consultation, fundraising, and advocacy to ensure the success of the trail. The RDBN is proud to partner with Cycle 16 and support trail development through design consultation and construction of the existing section of the project. This unique and successful partnership has paved the way for today's exciting investment announcement from the Province of BC. Additional stages of the project will, once complete, connect the Town of Smithers and the Village of Telkwa, through the surrounding rural Electoral Area A (Smithers/Telkwa Rural), with one continuous, multi-use, 10.5 km-long commuter trail.

Phase 1 of the project, from Smithers to Laidlaw Road, was completed in June of 2023. That project was made possible through notable support from the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, as well as a \$1,465,940 grant from the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program – COVID-19 Resilience Infrastructure Stream.

'A safe commuter trail connecting the rural areas around the municipalities of Smithers and Telkwa has long been recognised as a need. This trail will not only increase safety, but also encourage active lifestyles and add to the availability of safe, accessible outdoor recreation opportunities for residents and visitors. We are so pleased to see the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure's support for the project expanded in such a significant way"
