RE: 8000-P114-202404929 – Application to Disclose Certain Annual Facilities Survey Data

The Board of Directors for the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako (RDBN) has reviewed the abovenote application and wishes to communicate its unqualified support for it.

Like the Province of BC, the RDBN believes the CRTC should disclose certain Annual Facilities Survey data relating to the provision of Internet and mobile wireless services in Canada. We agree that the CRTC should improve the granularity of the ISED Internet Availability Map to show service provider location and technology on 250-meter road segment levels, and we urge the CRTC to share complete Internet/mobile wireless service provider facilities/transport data with all provincial and territorial governments on a confidential basis.

We support British Columbia's assertion that information submitted to the CRTC on available services, plans, and speeds is not consistently treated as confidential by this country's Internet and Mobile Wireless Service Providers. In our experience, although most service providers have refused to share this information directly with us, it is readily available on provider websites and offered to citizens by ISP/MWSP customer service representatives. For these reasons, we agree that the CRTC should not treat this information as confidential.

The RDBN and the Province of British Columbia have a common desire to ensure that all residents regardless of their geographic location and socioeconomic status - have access to reliable, affordable Internet and mobile wireless services that meet or exceed national standards. Improved data sharing is a straightforward, effective way to further our shared connectivity mandates. Identifying areas that lack essential telecommunications services is a data-driven activity, and the inability to obtain the requisite data hinders government's ability to maximize connectivity benefits to citizens. While ISED makes programming and policy decisions based on the Facilities Survey data, BC's ability to do similar work lags because of the restrictions on available data. Our joint effectiveness will improve when we use the same datasets.

The Province of BC has worked closely with ISED for years. Similarly, our Board of Directors, through the RDBN's Connectivity Committee, has worked diligently since 2019 to (a) identify communities, neighbourhoods, and households in our region that do not have adequate Internet and mobile wireless services, and (b) partner with senior levels of government, Internet Service Providers, and Mobile Wireless Service Providers to extend essential telecommunications services to RDBN residents. Our efforts in this regard, and the Province of BC's ability to assist us, have been handicapped by a lack of detailed facilities/transport data. Our inability to access granular-level connectivity data has forced us to spend considerable time, effort, and money gathering information that the CRTC already possesses and ISPs/MWSPs routinely release to potential customers. Armed with only general (and, in some cases, anecdotal) information about existing services and infrastructure, we have been unable to identify all unserved/underserved households or develop effect plans to connect them. Building a comprehensive connectivity strategy without adequate baseline service data is like trying to construct a house atop shifting sand; the resulting structure might initially look okay but is unlikely to last or serve its intended purpose.

We trust this letter clearly communicates our unequivocal support for Application 8000-P114-202404929. It's time the CRTC shared granular Internet/mobile wireless service provider facilities/transport data on a confidential basis. Doing so is in the interest of Canadians. We submit, though, that this information shouldn't just be provided to provincial and territorial governments. Local governments like the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako also need access to it for planning and service delivery purposes.
